Single Stream Recycling

MIXED RECYCLING:

- Mixed Paper
- Cardboard (flattened)
- Glass, Metal & Plastic

New Materials Accepted:

- Aerosol cans (empty)
- Car parts (fluid removed, < 40 lbs. & must fit in cart)
- Aluminum foil, trays and pans (empty)
- Frozen food packaging (paper/cardboard)
- All plastic containers with or without numbers
- Plastic flower pots (except black)
- Plastic bags and film plastic (bagged)

According to the EPA, **63.9 percent** of what goes into landfills is paper, plastic, metal and glass.

Yardwaste, Organic, and Compostable Recycling

YARDWASTE RECYCLING:

- Grass trimmings
- Leaves
- Small branches 3 ft or less
- Weeds
- Plants

New Materials:

- Food soiled paper (napkins, paper plates, pizza boxes)
- Waxed Cardboard
- Tea Bags
- Coffee Grounds & Filters
- Paperboard milk cartons
- Pasta, Bread and dough products
- Fruit and Vegetables
- Meat (including Bones)
- Seafood (including Shells)
- Dairy
- Eggshells



Place all food scrap materials directly in the yard waste cart, or in newspaper or a paper bag first.



NOT ACCEPTED:

- Cornstarch utencils
- Bio-Degradable Plastics
- Liquid
- Garbage
- Pet Waste
- Treated wood or painted wood

Did You Know?



According to the EPA, 44.8 million tons of food scraps and yard waste are placed in the landfill.

Rotting organic matter in landfills turns into methane, one of the most potent global warming gasses.

Motor Oil & Cooking Oil Recycling





Used Motor Oil & Filters

- Used motor oil Place in onegallon plastic container with screw on lid
- Used motor oil filters Place in sealed clear zip lock bag

Cooking Oil

 Used cooking oil – Place in a one-gallon plastic container with a screw on lid, write "cooking oil" on container. Make sure oil is not hot!



Place items in a separate sealed plastic bag:

Like items may go in one bag (CFLs in one bag; batteries in one bag)

- Small dry-cell batteries
- Cell Phones
- Compact fluorescent bulbs

New Services:

- Single Stream Recycling
- Recycling Tote Bag provided by Recology™ Cupertino (for multi family)
- Organic and Compostable Recycling Service (to those that subscribe)
- Organic Kitchen Container (to those that subscribe to Organic Service)
- Collection of Hazardous Waste, Electronic Waste and Universal Waste through oncall collection program

 Drop-off containers at Multi family dwellings management offices for dry cell batteries and cell phone recycling

Door-to-Door Household Hazardous Waste Collection

- Residents MUST call Curbside, Inc. and schedule pick up
- Describe types and quantities of waste
- Kit is sent to customer which includes
 - instruction sheet
 - 4 mil plastic bag for waste
 - Labels for common items that are not labeled
 - One-way tie for the bag.
- Place bag near the door or garage by 7:00 AM on the designated day
- Accepts:
 - Typical Chemicals
 - Sharps
 - Pharmaceuticals
 - Electronics
 - Universal Waste.

More Information in Garbage Bill

On-Call Disposal Days

Single family residents only – who pay for garbage service

- Up to 2 collection days per year at no additional charge
- Call at least 2 business days in advance to schedule service

Pick up of one of the following:

- Garbage
- Construction and Demolition Debris
- Bulky Goods including Electronic and Universal Waste
- Compostable Materials and clean wood waste

Unused on-call collection days are not transferable from one calendar year to the next.



Environmental Day **Promoting Recycling & Reuse** Free drive-through, drop-off service for Cupertino residents

- To encourage extended use of products and to prevent valuable resources from being sent to the landfill.
- Shredding confidential documents *(Two box limit)*
- Yard Waste (processed for compost)
- Construction debris, <u>untreated</u> wood, dirt, rock and concrete
- Reusable furniture, clothing and shoes (for donation; NO dirty, broken, stained or torn furniture)







- Environmental Day **Promoting Recycling & Reuse** Free drive-through, drop-off service for Cupertino residents
- Children's plastic toys and play structures (for recycling)
- U-Waste (batteries, cell phones, compact fluorescent bulbs and fluorescent tubes)

 *E-Waste (computers, monitors and printers, etc.)

 Kitchen Appliances that do not contain Freon (washer, dryers, only the newer refrigerators, microwaves, toasters)









Bulky Item Collection

Bulky Items are: Items that weigh more than 50 pounds and are too large to fit into the appropriate wheeled cart

- All City of Cupertino residents
- March 26 through October 23, 2010
- Fridays & Saturdays 8:30am-11:30am
- Drive to Compost site on Stevens Creek Canyon Rd

Things to Bring:

- Drivers license verifying resident of Cupertino
- 2 heavy bags or 2 garbage cans per person
- Shovels & person to help

Recology Cupertino Home Composting Classes





- Two Free Backyard Compost Classes per year will be offered by Recology
- Free "BioStack" compost bins will be provided by Recology™ Cupertino (one per household) for Cupertino residents who take a Recology Home Composting Class
 - At the end of the Recology Home Composting Class, residents may claim their bin or have it delivered to their house
 - The First Home Composting Class will be at Cupertino Community Hall on November 20, 2010

Bay Friendly Gardening and Compost Classes





- Residents are strongly encouraged to take the free Bay Friendly Gardening (BFG) Classes offered through the County of Santa Clara
- A Free "BioStack" compost bin will be provided by Recology™ Cupertino (one per household) for Cupertino residents who take a BFG Class
 - At the end of the BFG class, residents may contact Recology to request their free BioStack bin
 - Or, residents may purchase a compost bin and submit a copy of their receipt and proof of class attendance for a full credit which will be subtracted from the next garbage bill
