Fall Green Scene

Fight food waste in your home:

According to the non-profit Foodshift, Americans throw away about 25% of the food they bring home—that equates to over 20 pounds of food per person per month! This fall, lower your grocery bill and curb your environmental impact by wasting less food. Keep tabs on what you already have in your fridge and pantry, identify items that need to be eaten soon, and plan meals that use those foods. Not sure whether that orange belongs on the counter or in the fridge? To keep food fresh as long as possible, brush up on proper food storage techniques at www.foodshift.net/reduce-your-waste, and understand your “Sell by” and “Use By” dates. Instead of tossing those leftovers, transform them into a new creative meal—leftover veggies and rice make a great stir fry, and aging fruit makes a delicious smoothie! Walk or bike to school:

Get into your green groove this new school year by encouraging your children to try an active route. Join your child on their walk or bike ride, or take turns with other parents in the neighborhood walking or biking with a group of kids. Be sure to look out for new green bike lanes in our City and visit www.cupertino.org/bicycling for suggested safe routes to school or for bike maps of Cupertino. Find out if your child’s school is a partner in Cupertino’s Safe Routes to School program (www.cupertino.org/saferoutes). If the school is not yet involved, talk to your PTA or other interested individuals about starting the partnership.

Grey is the new green:

Although 2016 brought us nearly average rainfall, California is still recovering from drought conditions—one wet winter won’t make up for four dry ones! This fall, think ahead and start preparing your spring garden to conserve water by installing a graywater laundry-to-landscape system. These systems reuse your washing machine water for nearby landscaping, conserving water and cutting your utility costs. Rebates for these systems are available at www.valleywater.org.

Make your Halloween spooky & sustainable:

As you gear up for ghouls and goblins this October, consider greening your Halloween fun. Instead of buying a new costume at the store, score a truly unique look by scouring your local thrift store, borrowing a costume from a friend, re-purposing existing clothes, or even fashioning your costume from recycled materials. Decorate with locally-grown pumpkins and gourds and use scrap or recycled paper for all spooky and sustainable décor. Hand out locally-sourced, organic treats. After your haunted festivities have ended, continue the green fun by composting your pumpkin and other leftover food in your brown cart and recycling all your bottles and cans.


