SCENIC CIRCLE ACCESS TO STEVENS CREEK TRAIL & BLACKBERRY FARM PARK

ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE QUESTIONS

Question: Has the City decided what type of CEQA document will be needed for Scenic Circle Access to Stevens Creek Trail and Blackberry Farm Park?

Answer: There is no decision on what type of document will be needed. The review process has not occurred yet. Now that Council has directed staff to proceed, we will initiate the environmental review process. An Initial Study will be prepared for the project. Based on the results of the Initial Study, a decision will be made regarding the most appropriate CEQA document to prepare.

Question: After the environmental documents are prepared, how long will the public comment period be?

Answer: Minimum public review periods for environmental documents are set by statute and regulation and depend on whether the review process involves the State Clearinghouse. The review period may range from 20 days (for a Negative Declaration or Mitigated Negative Declaration not circulated to the State Clearinghouse) to 45 days (for an EIR circulated to the State Clearinghouse).”

Question: How can I sign up to be notified when the environmental documents are completed and ready for review?

Answer: Staff has set up an information site for Scenic Circle Access to Stevens Creek Trail and Blackberry Farm Park on the city website. Interested parties can sign up for electronic email notification there, or they can send an email request directly to capitalprojects@cupertino.org.
