



# REPLANTING OUR CITY FOREST

The City of Cupertino, Public Works Department has begun a four year project to replant the City forest. This replanting effort will include the planting of approximately 1600 street trees. Street trees are located within the City right of way either in the park strip or behind the sidewalk.



Replanting in your neighborhood will be phased according to the reforestation program map below.



**Planting of trees will generally occur in all available areas.** However, some areas may not be planted due to local considerations such as:

- Available planting space
  - Larger varieties of trees from the Master Tree List require a minimum of five feet of space. Smaller varieties may be planted in areas with two feet of space.
- Conflicts with underground and overhead utilities
- Requirement to maintain visibility for vehicular traffic
- Conflicts with private trees

Several weeks prior to planting in your neighborhood, door knob flyer notifications will be distributed advising residents that a tree of a selected variety will be planted. The flyer placed on your door will either ask you to pick a tree variety from a list <http://www.cupertino.org/trees> or to advise you that a tree variety has been selected from the list.
