
A unique opportunity for a private tour of the Nike Missile Site Museum in Marin, an educational Cold War museum at Fort Barry in the heart of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area. Explore the complete SF Bay-Delta system at a glance with a docent-led tour of the Bay Model Visitor Center in Sausalito.

Then enjoy lunch at Cavallo Point's Murray Circle Restaurant at the former Army Base at Fort Baker.

Feel the history of the cold war lurking beneath the hills of the Marin Headland at the SF-88 Nike Missile Launch Site Museum at Fort Barry. The only fully-restored missile site out of the 300 Nike sites in the nation, this site is now a museum staffed by Golden Gate National Recreation Area rangers. This former top-secret Nike Missile Site was the last line of defense against Soviet bombers built by the United States Army from 1959-1973. It's a great chance for you to see the tools of the Cold War up close.


BAY MODEL VISITOR CENTER

Our docent-led tour of the Bay Model Visitor Center hosts a three-dimensional hydraulic model of the San Francisco Bay and Delta areas capable of simulating real tides and currents.

The model represents an area from the Pacific Ocean to Sacramento and Stockton, including the San Francisco, San Pablo and Suisun Bays and a portion of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

Once used for research, it was built to determine if building dams in the SF Bay was a viable idea. The

model is approximately 320 feet long in the north-south direction and about 400 feet long in the east-west direction.



Enjoy our included lunch at Murray Circle Restaurant in the former Army Base at Fort Baker at the historic Cavallo Point Lodge.

Cavallo Point's acclaimed restaurant, Murray Circle, is one of the Bay Area's top culinary destinations. Highlighting refined modern Northern California cuisine anchored to its Marin roots, the freshest local ingredients and stunning Golden Gate Bridge views - a meal here is inspired!

Fort Baker was built long before there was a Golden Gate Bridge. In 1866, the U.S. Army acquired the site for a military base to fortify the north side of the Golden Gate.

The Army post remained active through World War II. In 1973 Fort Baker was listed as a Historic District in the National Register of Historic Places.
