The arboretum maintains collections of rare and threatened plants of unusual scientific interest, including 90 species of Eucalyptus and large groupings of South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, and California natives.



The Bargetto brothers, originally from Italy, closed their first winery in San Francisco due to Prohibition. They bought land in Soquel in 1917 where their current winery still stands and thrives. Their family invites us to experience the long tradition and dramatic beauty of this internationally acclaimed appellation.
