## September Focus – Walking!

### Walking 30 minutes per day:

- Alleviates depression and fatigue
- Increases attention and decision making
- Limits chronic disease
- Halves risk of Alzheimer's
- Lowers risk of heart disease
- Improves blood pressure by 5 points
- Works arm, ab, and shoulder muscles
- Reduces lower back pain
- Limits colon cancer risk by 40%
- Strengthens legs, quads, hips, hamstrings
- Improves fitness

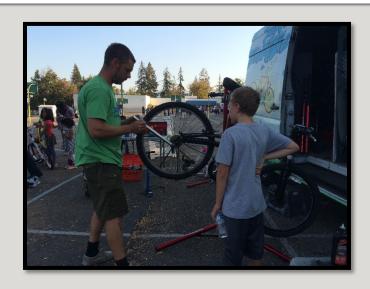
