Exploring Gems of Santa Cruz

Nature is in full bloom in Santa Cruz and we will experience it during our two private docent-led tours! The UC Santa Cruz Arboretum, established in 1967, is a rich and diverse collection containing representatives of more than 300 plant families. The arboretum maintains collections of rare and threatened plants of unusual scientific interest, including 90 species of Eucalyptus and large groupings from South Africa, New Zealand, Australia, and California natives. The grapevines of Santa Cruz County are in the height of their season, as wineries begin their "crush." We will enjoy a private docent-led tour of the Bargetto Winery and learn its rich history before we sit down to learn about their award-winning wines. The Bargetto brothers, originally from Italy, closed their first winery in San Francisco due to Prohibition. They bought land in Soquel in 1917 where their current winery still stands and thrives. Their family invites experience the long tradition and dramatic beauty of this internationally acclaimed appellation. We will enjoy time on Pacific Avenue in downtown Santa Cruz for a no-host lunch and shopping! With places to eat such as *Roise McCann's Irish Pub and Restaurant* (comfort), *Laili Restaurant* (Mediterranean), *El Palomar Restaurant* (Mexican), *Kiantis Pizza and Pasta Bar* (Italian), and *Zachary's Restaurant* (American) your palate will surely be satisfied.

Fleet Week: The Blue Angels and Parade of Ships Friday, October 7, 8:30am-6pm

Come join us for Fleet Week starring the Blue Angels and the Parade of Ships as they arrive in San Francisco! We'll watch the jaw-dropping precision of the Navy air show pilots overhead as the spectacular Blue Angels roar in over the Golden Gate Bridge! Six navy fighter planes perform frighteningly daring stunts over San Francisco Bay - this is precision flying at its most breathtaking. Enjoy a premium vantage point for the Parade of Navy Ships and the Blue Angels air show from our waterfront box seats along the Marina Green. We will also have access to food booths and vendors along the Marina Green, as well as the Fleet Week Humanitarian Village, illustrating the military working together for emergency preparedness in San Francisco. The Parade of Ships will signal the start of the 2016 San Francisco Fleet Week as they sail majestically under the Golden Gate Bridge. Participating ships will include the USS Cape St. George, the USS Coronado, the USS Stockdale, and the US Coast Guard Cutter Boutwell. Nearly 4,500 Sailors, Marines and Coast Guardsmen will participate in this year's event. A special air show will start us out with a series of stunt planes swooping and looping above the water. Performances by other aircraft will include the U.S. Navy Leap Frogs (parachutists), Sean D. Tucker and Team Oracle (biplane stunts), The Patriots Jet Team, and Royal Canadian Air Force jet. New this year is the F-22 Raptor fighter jet, a highly maneuverable, tactical fighter jet with stealth capabilities. It can fly at twice the speed of sound!

Join us in Gilroy Gardens for the magical nighttime light displays of Lumination, a festival of light celebrating over 2000 years of Chinese culture and tradition. For the first time ever on the West Coast, we will view colossal reproductions of historic landmarks like the Great Wall, Temple of Heaven, and Terra Cotta Warriors—as well as playful pandas, the mythical Qilin, and a giant dragon built from porcelain plates and bowls. Duarte Nursery also has poinsettia triples, decorative bowls, and vases with poinsettias. After shopping for your holiday poinsettias, we will head over to Hilmar Cheese Company for a docent led motor coach tour of the facility, as well as a guided tour of the visitor center, where we will learn how cheese is made and explore interactive, hands-on exhibits about cows, dairies and cheese making. We'll watch Daisy's "moooovie" in the Cheese Theatre and watch employee's package the 540-pound "big cheese." Founded in 1984, Hilmar Cheese annually produces more cheese and whey from one site than any other manufacturer in the world. Enjoy a catered meal featuring their homemade "signature soup," Hilmar Cheese Chowder, along with a green salad. A selection of entrées will include Medallions of Salmon with lemon caper butter sauce and Breast of Chicken Dijon baked in a panko-parmesan crust, with seasonal vegetables and roasted potato medley. SF MOMA – San Francisco Museum of Modern Art Tuesday, January 10, 8:30am-3:15pm

Come join us for a private docent-led tour of the newly remodeled SFMOMA in San Francisco! Our tour will reveal highlights from its four collections: architecture and design, painting and sculpture, media arts, and photography.
