Enrollment in SVCE's GreenStart, which provides 100% carbon-free energy, is automatic to residents and businesses in Cupertino and will take place over a six-month period, in three phases – April, July and October 2017. You will know when you're enrolled when you receive notices in the mail. You can expect to receive two notices before enrollment, and two after enrollment. If you are really interested in renewable electricity for your home or business, you can upgrade to GreenPrime anytime and start receiving 100% electricity for a small premium.
