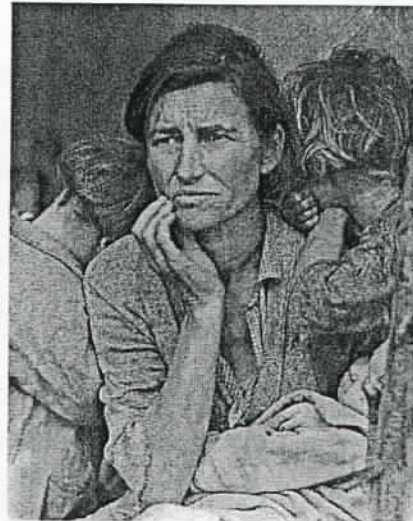

As you explore, take advantage of a unique chance to experience the work of one of America's most influential photographers: **Dorothea Lange**. Few 20th Century photographers produced such instantly recognizable and iconic works as Lange.

Through the lens of her camera, Lange documented American life with riveting intimate photographs that showed the major issues of the times.

View the emotional and political impact of her works in this major exhibition, from documenting the plight of Dust Bowl migrants during the great Depression to magnifying the grim conditions of incarcerated Japanese Americans during World War II, Lang's photographs demonstrate how empathy and compassion -- focused on art -- can trigger political action.

Enjoy a no-host lunch at the museum's Blue Oak Café. California is known for its pioneering approaches to food, drawing on the state's multicultural influences and its vast variety of food sources, and chefs who continually invent new culinary traditions. The café carries on the legacy with a menu filled with inspired dishes featuring seasonal and local ingredients that reflect the many cultures of California.
