#### **Contribute to a cleaner Cupertino**

The fall season is a beautiful and colorful time in Cupertino. More leaves and potential storms, however, mean that extra efforts are needed to keep the streets clean and the gutters flowing. To help keep your neighborhood streets clean this fall, consider these quick tips:

- Move your car for street sweeping. Street sweeping occurs two times per month in residential areas 7:30am-3:30pm. When you leave your car on the street, sweepers can't clean the litter and harmful pollutants that accumulate on neighborhood streets. - Deposit leaves from your private property into your brown cart. To prevent flooding and protect our creeks, leaves should NOT be raked or piled into the street.
- Drain downspout water to landscaping. Ensuring all water makes its way to landscaping helps recharge the water table.
