


Rail Corridor History

- Originally part of the South Pacific Coast Railroad
- Traveled 80-miles from Alameda to Santa Cruz
- Carried passengers and freight
- Constructed in 1880, partially closed in 1940's due to damage caused by mudslides
- Currently owned by Union Pacific Railroad
- Permanente Local trains now run one round trip per week between San Jose and the cement plant















Project History

- A Rail-with-Trail was first identified in the 1995
 Santa Clara County Trails Master Plan
- Other Plans that promote the Rail Trail:
 - VTA's Active Transportation Plan 2020
 - Union Pacific Rail Trail Feasibility Study (2001)
 - Santa Clara County General Plan
 - Cupertino Bicycle Transportation Plan (2016)














Project Extent
