

Drop-off Sites for Mercury Containing Products, Electronics, & Other Hazardous Items

Some common household items are toxic or environmentally harmful, and should not be thrown in the trash. It is illegal to dispose of these items (called universal waste) in the garbage.

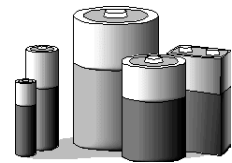


Fluorescent Lights (Including compact bulbs & straight, circular, spiral, & U-bent tubes)

- Ziplock sealed plastic bag on top of your blue recycling cart.

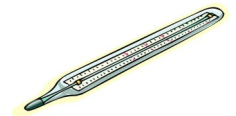
Batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, button cell, 9-volt, rechargeable)

- Regular household batteries (alkaline) can be put into a clear plastic bag and placed on top of your blue recycling cart.
