Holiday Banners and Median Lighting

In preparation for the upcoming holiday season, Public Works staff has completed the installation of 100 holiday banners throughout Cupertino. Below are the locations where the banners can be seen. Holiday lighting has been placed on the medians on Stevens Creek and De Anza Boulevards, but will not be lit until the City's tree lighting ceremony has taken place on November 30.

- N. Stelling Road in front of the Quinlan Center
- Stevens Creek Boulevard from Stelling Road to De Anza Boulevard
- De Anza Boulevard from Bollinger Road to Hwy 280
- Torre Avenue east side from Pacifica Drive to Rodrigues Avenue

Cupertino Recognized by SPUR

The City of Cupertino was selected for two SPUR Impact Awards for our staff's work on creating Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) and the Vallco Town Center Specific Plan. The SPUR Impact Awards acknowledge the outstanding impact by public sector employees in city and county government in Santa Clara County, honoring those making a difference, within government and the community at large. Award recipients are being recognized for significant accomplishments in the areas of housing, transportation, placemaking and urban design, and sustainability and resilience. Each project team will be recognized at the [SPUR Impact Awards](#) luncheon on March 22, 2019.

The San Francisco Bay Area Planning and Urban Research Association (SPUR) brings people together from across the political spectrum to develop solutions to the big problems cities face. Through research, education and advocacy, SPUR promotes good

planning and good government in the San Francisco Bay Area and are recognized as a leading civic planning organization.

Water District Approves Stevens Creek Fish Passage Project at Deep Cliff

On Tuesday, October 23, 2018, the Santa Clara Valley Water District Board of Directors unanimously approved a \$120,000 grant for the Stevens Creek Steelhead Passage Project at Deep Cliff Golf Course. The project will consist of constructing three parallel rock weirs in Stevens Creek on the Deep Cliff Golf Course property to facilitate juvenile steelhead trout upstream passage along the creek. The owners of the Deep Cliff Golf Course agreed to grant access for needed improvements prior to the grant submission.

The total project budget is estimated to be between \$140,000 and \$160,000 and will be paid for with the Water District grant and required matching funds from project partners. This project was a collaboration between the Friends of Stevens Creek Trail and the cities of Cupertino, Los Altos, Mountain View, and Sunnyvale. As part of the application, the cities committed to each providing \$9,900 to meet the matching fund requirement to qualify the project for a major grant award.

The Cupertino City Council unanimously approved the request for \$9,900 in matching grant funds (conditional on Water District approval) at the March 6, 2018 Council meeting (File # 17-3016). The Friends of Stevens Creek trail expects to begin project work in the spring of 2019 and complete all work by the end of 2019.

BayArea511 Carpool Event held for City staff

The Sustainability Division and Bay Area 511 teamed up to hold an employee event, the morning of November 14, to inform staff about available carpooling App's, [Scoop & Waze Carpool](#). Over the course of a few hours, over 50 staff members stopped by the table set up in City Hall lobby, and downloaded one of the App's and learned how to use them.
