Fall 2018 Student Transportation Survey Results





Survey History & Purpose

- Cupertino's Safe Routes to School program has been collecting student transportation data biannually since the fall of 2015 to understand citywide student transportation trends across all grade levels.
- Data is collected for 3 days during a one-week period. Teachers ask students how they travel to and from school and mark the students' responses on the Student Travel Tally questionnaire from the National Safe Routes to School Partnership.
- The information we collect is used to inform program decision making and provide data for grant proposals.
- The results in this report include data from the Fall 2018 survey as well as historic data through fall 2015.

Stevens Creek Walk & Roll Wednesday has an impact!


Garden Gate has highest citywide walking rate.

- Response rate is 75%.






*Dramatic Increase in walking rate due to change in how school counted walkers. Faria is an alternative school (not a neighborhood school) which draws students from across the district. Students can live as far as 4.5 miles from school. Teachers counted students as walkers if they were driven to the neighborhood and walked from there. Distance students walked is unknown.



Garden Gate Elementary School

- Highest walking rate out of all 14 schools.
- Increase in PM walking rate and dip in PM family vehicle rate.
- Increase in afternoon carpool rate, from 5% in AM to 15% in PM.
- Response rate is 82%.



- Fewer students carpooling in AM than ever before.
- Response rate is 80%.



- Response rate is 84%.



- Unable to determine response due to change in attendance.



Hyde achieves their highest carpooling rate to date.


Kennedy students choose to carpool and walk in the afternoon.

- Response rate is 78%.






Cupertino High shows little change to historic averages.

- Response rate is 17%.




