PURPOSE To increase bird safety by reducing hazardous building and lighting design

BACKGROUND

- Fiscal Year 2019/20 City Council Work Program Item
- 2.9+ billion birds in North America lost since 1970
- Birds are critical to our ecosystem and provide benefits such as:
 - Plant pollination
 - Seed dispersal
 - Insect and rodent control

PROTECTING BIRDS FROM COLLISIONS

Consideration 1: Applicable Projects

- New buildings/new additions
- Remodels and retrofits
- Window replacements
- Existing buildings

Consideration 2: Applicable Locations

- City-wide or specific neighborhood/zones
- Sensitive areas near parks, green space, bodies of water, vegetated areas

Consideration 3: Exemptions

- Historic buildings
- Small residential buildings
- Retail frontages

Consideration 4: Mitigation Measures

- Mandatory or recommended
 - Prohibit or limit glass in specific areas on a building
 - Glazing/Exterior treatments
 - Netting
 - Patterned/fritted windows
 - Exterior design elements
 - Avoid placement of bird attractants near glass
 - Prohibit or limit design elements on buildings (glass atriums with interior landscaping, glass tunnels, etc.)
 - Interior design élements
 - Blinds or curtains
 - Documentation (Bird Collision Reduction Plan)
 - Donation of dead bird specimens to conservation organization

MAKING THE NIGHT DARK

Consideration 1: Applicability

- All properties (residential, commercial, etc.)
- New permits (planning and building)
- Existing lighting to continue

Consideration 2: Exemptions

- Holiday/temporary lighting
- Permitted lighting for signs
- Accent lighting
- Lighting in the public right-of-way
- Art work lighting

Consideration 3: Lighting Fixtures

- Shielded lighting
 - Light trespass

Consideration 4: Lighting Controls

- Automated control system
 - Motion sensor lights
 - Photo-cells
 - Self-extinguishing

Consideration 5: Deviation from Lighting Standards

• Allow for deviation in standards?

Consideration 6: Prohibited Lighting

- Flashing or blinking lighting
- Up-lighting
- Lights for game courts
- Flood lights
- Aerial
