


More than half of India's population is under the age of 25!

- Naan is an oven-baked flatbread
- Naan is made with yogurt, milk and sometimes eggs or butter
- To make Naan bakers shape the dough into a ball and place it in the interior walls of a tandoor (a clay oven)

Gandhi's Birthday

- Observed on October 2nd .
- Gandhi is known as the "Father of Nation"
- He was a political and spiritual leader in India who believed in a non-violence approach
- Gandhi is displayed on the Indian rupee



Independence Day

- August 15th, 1947 was the day India gained its independence from British 200 year rule
- Celebrations including parades, pageants and flag waving.
- The celebrations begin at the Red Fort in the capital city of New Delhi with its annual unfolding of the flag



Cinema



- In 1913 the first ever full length film was released by producer Dadasaheb Phalke.
- His full length silent film was called Raja Harishchandra
- This was the first Indian film that was screened in London.

Bollywood

Bollywood movies are like musicals, they have song and dance scenes.

There are around 1,000 Bollywood films produced every year

Henna

Henna is a small flowering shrub. The leaves are dried and turned into a fine powder. That powder is used to dye clothes, hair and for dying the skin.

The art of henna is known as Mehndi and traditionally used during celebrations.



Henna can last between one to three weeks.

For Hindu weddings, brides paint their hands and feet as a symbol of joy, beauty and spiritual awakening.





Republic Day

- Occurs every year on January 26th
- On January 26th, 1950 India became a democratic republic nation
- Celebration include a grand parade in New Delhi, patriotic activities, military displays and most business are closed

Other Holidays

Holi

- The Festival of Color
- Is celebrated on the month of Phalgun which is the 12th month in the Hindu Calendar (usually around February and March)
- On this day people dance on the street and throw water and colored dye powders



Diwali

- The Festival of Lights is a five day festival
- Similar to the Chinese New Year, Diwali is a festival about family, starting over and keeping bad energy away.
- Homes are decorated with clay lamps and Rangoli's are created on the doorways and courtyards

Animals

National Bird of India: Peacock

- The Peacock was declared the national bird in 1963.
- It is a symbol of grace, beauty and pride

- In India, Cricket is the most popular sport
- The first cricket match was played in 1721 after the British introduced the sport to India
- The India National Cricket team won the Cricket World Cup in 1983 and 2011



Eden Gardens Stadium



- The Bengal Tiger was declared the national animal of India in April 1973
- You can find a Bengal tiger in tropical rainforests, marshes and tall grasses.



- The Eden Gardens Stadium is the largest cricket stadium in India
- It is also the largest stadium in Asia
- The stadium can seat 68,000 people
- It is home to the Bengal Cricket team and the Kolkata Knight Riders
