Dear 2020 Summer Volunteer Applicant,

Greetings from Cupertino's Parks and Recreation Department! We are thrilled you want to become an integral member of our summer team. This packet is intended to provide you with detailed information about the LIT and JSI application processes. Please carefully read all application information and be sure to make note of important dates and requirements.

<u>Please note</u>: due to the popularity of this program, there is an application process with supplemental questions and there will be an interview process required. Interviews are tentatively scheduled to occur on <u>May 10, 2020</u>.

Summer Volunteer Program

The primary goal of Cupertino's Summer Volunteer Program (SVP) is to create and foster leadership through hands-on experience at our summer camps and aquatics programs. While anyone between the ages of 14-18 may apply, we would like to remind all applicants that space is limited and acceptance into the program will be based on answers to supplemental questions, availability, and interviews, if necessary. Any teen with a strong desire to work with children is encouraged to apply. Successful LITs and JSIs are generally enthusiastic, dedicated, and devoted to providing our camp and aquatics participants with a memorable experience.

What is a Leader in Training/Junior Swim Instructor?

Leaders in Training and Junior Swim Instructors are invaluable members of our summer team as they provide support to our recreation leaders and aquatics instructors. Volunteers are trained in supervision, safety, aquatics procedures, problem-solving, and leading camp activities. They will receive on-the-job training and job skills that are not available through other mediums and will assist staff with leading camp activities and swim lessons. At the end of each week, volunteers will receive evaluations of their participation and suggestions for areas of improvement. Teens who want to cultivate their leadership skills are encouraged to work/volunteer 4-8 weeks of summer.

COVID-19

Safety is a top priority. With the ongoing uncertainty over COVID-19, City staff is making concentrated efforts toward following the guidelines released by the Santa Clara County

Department of Health, but please note the fluidity of the situation may affect the status and timeline of the SVP this summer. City staff will swiftly communicate with our participants and share new information that may modify the program, such as new interview dates or training dates. Be sure to accurately input yours and your students' contact information.

In-service Training

In-service week is temporarily scheduled for June 8th - June 12th. During this week, our LITs and JSIs will become versed in behavior management, the developmental characteristics of children, and how to deal with challenging scenarios. In addition to these skills, we will be reviewing the following modules of leadership and job preparedness:

- Customer Service Skills
- Safety protocols
- Public Speaking
- Resume Writing & Interview Prep
- ...and more!

By the end of the summer, our goal is for volunteers to feel more confident in themselves, their leadership style, and be able to successfully prepare for the workforce.

Requirements & Expectations

Volunteers that are admitted to the program will be expected to meet the following requirements:

- Must be at least 14 years old by June 8, 2020 (first day of In-service training).
- Attending In-service week (<u>June 8 12</u>) is mandatory.
- Volunteer for a minimum of 2 weeks, in addition to the in-service week. For aquatics and camps, 2 consecutive weeks is required.
- Must provide their transportation to and from program sites.

Selection of Summer Volunteer Team:

Due to the increasing popularity and standards of the program, we will be using the answers to the supplemental questions and interview performance to select our volunteer team. We will also look at an applicant's availability to determine acceptance into the program. Interviews are tentatively scheduled for Sunday, May 10, 2020.

Once selected, LITs/JSIs will be sent acceptance emails with the next steps on completing TB testing, fingerprinting, and submission of the program payment. Program assignments will be received in mid to late May.

<u>Junior Swim Instructor - Frequently Asked Questions</u>

- Q: I'm not available for the full week of in-service training. May I still take part in the program?
- A: Volunteers must be available for the full in-service training program and at least two additional weeks throughout the summer. For safety and training reasons, exceptions will not be made for new volunteers.
- Q: Where do I submit my application?
- **A**: We are accepting online applications. Please navigate to this <u>SurveyMonkey link</u> to submit your application and supplemental question answers.
- Q: How will the COVID-19 pandemic affect the Summer Volunteer Program?
- A: With the ongoing uncertainty over COVID-19, City staff is making efforts toward following the distancing guidelines released by the Santa Clara County Department of Health. City staff will make swift efforts to communicate updates over the program.
- Q: I am currently unsure of my summer plans. Will I be able to sign-up later?
- **A:** We have limited spots, and all spots will be filled within the week of the deadline. If any spots remain, they will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- **Q:** When will I know if I am selected for the program?
- **A:** Notifications will be sent out via email no later than May 15th. In-service and summer schedules will be sent out the last week in May.
- **Q:** What is the cost of the program? Why is there a cost?
- **A:** The fee is \$50 for residents and \$60 for non-residents. The fee covers the cost of fingerprinting, TB testing, first-aid/CPR certification, and staff supervision.
- Q: I will be taking summer school classes. Can I still participate in the program?
- **A:** On the volunteer interest form, there is an area to select your preferred time of day. Please only select times that you will be available.
- Q: Will I receive documentation for my service hours?
- **A:** If you require hour documentation, please talk to City staff at the end of your volunteer period and we will complete the appropriate documents.
- Q: Are there any uniform requirements?
- **A:** Yes, all volunteers will be provided with a shirt which they must wear during their volunteer shift. In addition, Junior Swim Instructors must wear a swimsuit from the approved list, which will be provided to all approved JSIs. It is the JSI's responsibility to cover the cost of their swimwear.
