Education and Qualifications:

Schools, traffic, reckless development, the environment, and economic uncertainty are Cupertino residents' concerns. Our City Council is now resident-focused. We adopted Objective Standards, preventing exploitative development. We funded library expansion, parkland, & bicycle infrastructure.
