REUSABLE BAGS Q&A

Q: Are reusable bags allowed again?

A: Yes, reusable bags are allowed in grocery stores that have implemented protective measures to prevent employee contact with customers' reusable bags (such as requiring customers to bag their own groceries in the cart or in a designated bagging area).

We recommend you bring your bags and ask the cashier about their preferred procedure, as each store may differ. If you do not have your bag or can not bring it inside the store, you can put items back in the cart loose and bag at your car.

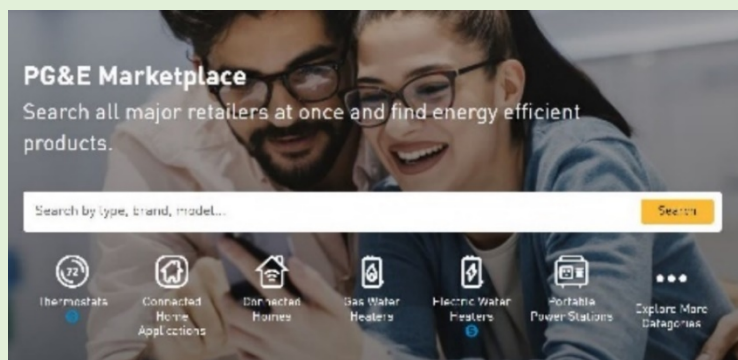
