NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at its meeting of Tuesday, March 16, 2021 at 6:45 p.m., the Cupertino City Council will consider a Municipal Code Amendment to adopt changes to Chapter 19:56, Density Bonus, of the Cupertino Municipal Code (CMC) to allow increased density bonuses for projects providing higher percentages of affordable units in a housing development project. The density bonuses vary by income level. The Planning Commission considered the proposed Municipal Code Amendments at its regular meeting on Tuesday, February 23, 2021 and recommended with a 4-1 vote (No: Kapil) that the Council adopt the draft ordinance to find the project exempt from CEQA and adopt the changes. In accordance with Governor Newsom's Executive Order No-29-20, this will be a teleconference meeting without a physical location. Members of the public will be able to observe and address the meeting telephonically or otherwise electronically from the City's website through procedures that will be detailed in the published meeting agenda.
