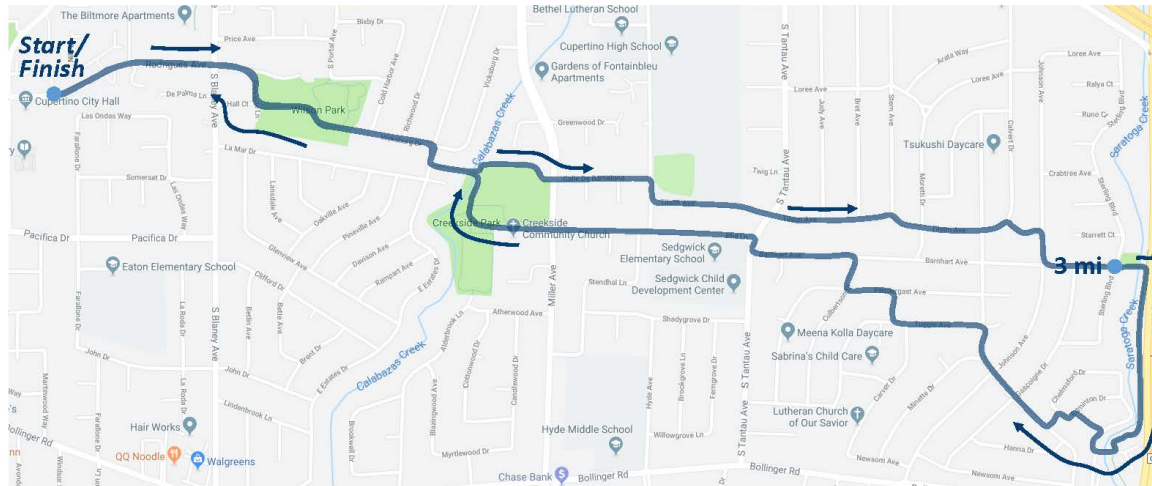

2021 Fall Bike Fest Family Ride



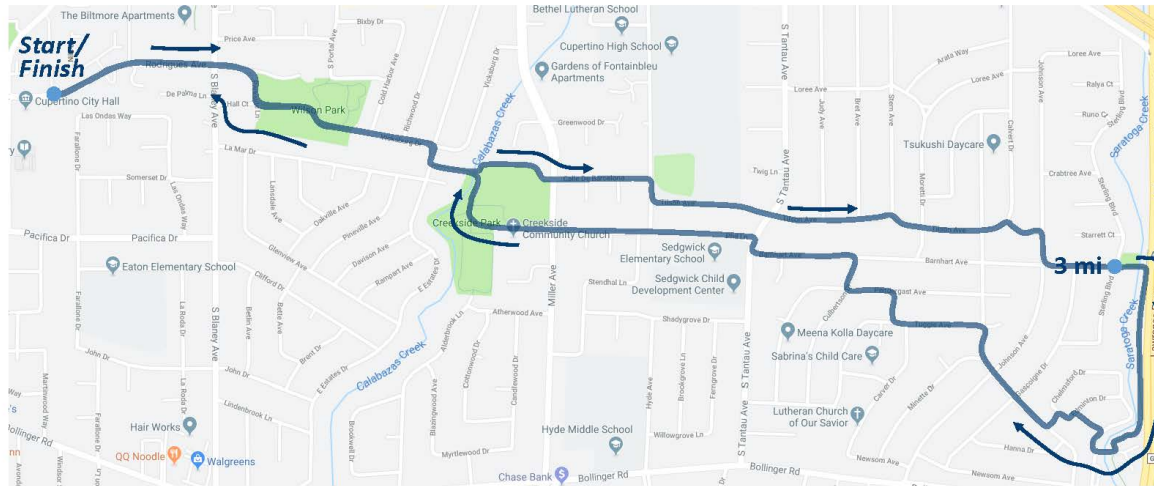
5.5mi Distance 69ft Elevation Gain Road Ride Type
