

Descriptive text for Cupertino Evacuation Zone CUP-E006

1. This map is intended to serve as a planning resource, not a guide when you are in the process of evacuating. Plan for yourself and your household ahead of time.
2. In an incident evacuation routes and temporary evacuation points as well as specific instructions will be provided by public safety agencies.
3. Register to receive emergency notifications from the County alert and warning system, AlertSCC, by texting your zipcode to 888777, or by visiting AlertSCC.org. During an incident, registered individuals will be alerted using this system.
4. During an incident Radio Cupertino, 1670 AM, will broadcast relevant emergency messaging.
5. ZONE DESCRIPTION: This zone encompasses the Apple Park. South of E Homestead Rd, West of Swallow Way, Northeast of Junipero Serra Fwy 280 and Pruneridge Avenue, East of Wolfe Rd and Apple Park Way.
6. ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS: Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the east by traveling eastbound on Homestead. Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the west by traveling westbound on Homestead. Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the north by traveling northbound on Wolfe Rd, or south on southbound Wolfe Rd. I-280 is accessible westbound and eastbound from Wolfe Rd. Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the southeast by S Tantau Ave. An additional eastbound exit is provided by Pruneridge Ave..
7. Three steps toward emergency preparedness include Having a Plan, Knowing your Neighbors, and Being Ready to Go.
 - a. Have a Plan For every member of your household
