Descriptive text for Cupertino Evacuation Zone CUP-E007

- 1. This map is intended to serve as a planning resource, not a guide when you are in the process of evacuating. Plan for yourself and your household ahead of time.
- 2. In an incident evacuation routes and temporary evacuation points as well as specific instructions will be provided by public safety agencies.
- 3. Register to receive emergency notifications from the County alert and warning system, AlertSCC, by texting your zipcode to 888777, or by visiting AlertSCC.org. During an incident, registered individuals will be alerted using this system.
- 4. During an incident Radio Cupertino, 1670 AM, will broadcast relevant emergency messaging.
- 5. ZONE DESCRIPTION: The Zone encompasses the area southwest of I-280, northeast of Cristo Rei Drive and Permanente Creek, and East of St. Joseph Ave.. This zone includes the Forum residential communities and Maryknoll.
- 6. ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS: Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the east by traveling eastbound on Cristo Rei Drive to N Foothill Blvd. I-280 is accessible from N Foothill Blvd heading eastbound or westbound. In an emergency, the fire gate leading to St. Joseph Ave will be opened to evacuees leaving the zone northbound under I-280 toward Foot
- 7. Three steps toward emergency preparedness include Having a Plan, Knowing your Neighbors, and Being Ready to Go.
 - a. Have a Plan For every member of your household
