


## **Background**

On June 16, 2021, the City Council adopted the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Adopted Budget for the City of Cupertino. This spending plan of \$148,845,235 for all funds reflected a \$38.3 million increase from the Fiscal Year 2020-21 Proposed Budget of \$110,591,225. This is mainly due to capital outlay, transfers out, and special one-time projects from previously deferred items due to COVID-19 as well as an increase in City Work Program items. First quarter adjustments include carryovers and encumbrances for obligations from the previous fiscal year, as well as adjustments approved as part of any separate Council agenda item. Combined, these adjustments result in the amended operating budget of \$225,563,609.




#### Flow of Funds Chart (in Millions)




#### General Fund Revenues, Expenditures, and Fund Balance

To date the City's financial statement audit has yet to be issued and revenue, expenditure, and fund balance totals listed in this report are preliminary and subject to change after a full review by the City's auditors. City staff does not anticipate many if any changes from the auditors.








### **General Fund Revenue and Expenditure Trends**

As of September 30, 2021, General Fund expenditures are \$33.2 million; this represents 27% of the budgeted appropriations. Expenditures at the first quarter point of the prior three years ranged between 29% and 34% of the final actual expenditures which places current first quarter actuals within the range. General Fund revenues are at \$22.2 million; this represents 17% of the budgeted revenue. Revenues at the first quarter point of the prior three years were between 12% and 15%, placing this year slightly above the range. Staff will continue to monitor its leading revenue sources as the year progresses.






As of first quarter, overall revenue is tracking at \$22.2 million which is \$6.3 million, or 40%, higher than the same time last year and has been most impacted by changes in sales tax, intergovernmental, and transfers in.

As of first quarter, overall expenditures are tracking at \$33.2 million which is \$7.2 million, or 28%, higher than the same time last year. This is primarily due to increases in transfers out as a result of the American Rescue Plan Act funding strategy approved by City Council.










#### **General Fund Classification of Fund Balance**

As of the first quarter, staff anticipate the City will end FY 2021-22 with \$111.86 million in General Fund fund balance; approximately \$28.7 million higher than the Adopted Budget due to increased expenditure and revenue savings for 2020-21 Fiscal Year End as described previously as well as increased revenues over projections thus far in FY 2021-22.







# **Recommended Adjustments**


As of the first quarter, Departments are requesting budget adjustments to ensure they end the year within budget appropriations. The recommended adjustments are summarized in the table below:














# **Summary**
