The National Weather Service has issued a Freeze Warning for Santa Clara Valley for Wednesday night into Thursday morning. Dangerously cold temperatures are anticipated each night and morning from Wednesday through Saturday. Rain is expected Wednesday, with additional rainfall Thursday night into Friday. Snow may impact commuters traveling over Highway 17 on Thursday and Friday. Snow and freezing rain in other parts of the region are likely to impact travel Thursday through Saturday. #### **KEY POINTS**

- Dangerously cold overnight temperatures Wednesday night scattered showers through the
- sub-freezing temperatures expected, impacting the most vulnerable of communities
- Strong winds will continue through Wednesday morning before gradually diminishing Wednesday afternoon.
- A second round of stronger winds is expected on Thursday
- Cold temperatures remain over the weekend, but the showers are expected to subside
- Unsettled weather continues as another rain system is forecast to arrive early next week

## **SAFETY TIPS**

- 1. Check in frequently on your family, friends and neighbors who may be more vulnerable. Call 9-1-1 for life safety concerns. Vulnerable individuals include:
  - o homeless individuals.
  - o Individuals over 65
  - o Infants
  - o individuals with circulatory problems or those who are taking certain medications
  - o those with access and functional needs
  - o those without effective heating systems
  - o those who may not understand or have access to public safety information
- 2. Stay warm: Avoid being outside during the coldest part of the night or for extended periods of time in cold weather. Avoid excessive consumption of alcohol if you will be staying outside. Dress in layers. Wear a hat and gloves. Get out of wet clothes as soon as possible to avoid hypothermia.
- 3. Register to receive emergency alerts through www.AlertSCC.org
- 4. Report downed trees or debris. Text 3-1-1 through the app (or submit a request using ServiceFinder)
- 5. If you smell natural gas or see downed power lines call 9-1-1.
- 6. Avoid unnecessary travel when driving conditions are hazardous.
- 7. Sandbags are available at the City Corporation Yard 10555 Mary Ave
- 8. VTA is offering free rides to shelters for the unhoused. Cupertino Library is open as a warming location during regular business hours.

The <u>National Weather Service</u> anticipates cold, wet, and windy weather this week. Dangerously cold temperatures anticipated each night and morning Wednesday through Saturday. Rain is expected Wednesday, with additional rainfall Thursday night into Friday. Snow may impact commuters traveling over Highway 17 on Thursday and Friday. Snow and freezing rain in other parts of the region is also likely to impact travel Thursday through Saturday.

#### **KEY POINTS**

- A storm system arrives tonight with impacts lingering through late week
- Cold air behind the front will make for frigid temperatures Thursday through Saturday
- Northerly winds with stronger wind gusts will arrive Tuesday night, not diminishing until early Thursday morning

- Cold temperatures will lower snow levels to between 1,000 and 1, 500 feet
- Winter Storm Watch now in effect for higher elevations in the South Bay and Central Coast
- Light rain will arrive on Wednesday, but a secondary pulse Thursday will make the rainfall more widespread Thursday night and into much of Friday

## Protect yourself and your community by taking necessary precautions:

- 3. Have a plan for keeping yourself and your family safe during a power outage.
- 4. Register to <u>receive emergency alerts</u>
- 5. Report downed trees or debris by calling **3-1-1 (or** submit a request using <u>ServiceFinder</u>)

- Continued overnight low temperatures through Thursday morning

The <u>National Weather Service</u> anticipates cold overnight and early morning temperatures in Cupertino through Thursday morning, February 16 2023. Cold impacts include hypothermia with elevated risk to children, the elderly and those sleeping in cars or outdoors. County libraries, including the Cupertino Library, are available during regular business hours as places where people can go to get warm. Expanded shelter services may be available throughout the County.

#### Call 9-1-1 for life-safety concerns. Please call 2-1-1 for shelter locations.

The County Office of Emergency Management offers <u>Cold Weather Safety Messaging</u> in five languages. *Stay warm and be sure to check frequently on those most vulnerable*. Protect yourself and your community by taking necessary precautions:

- 1. **Avoid being outside** during the coldest part of the night, or for extended periods of time in extreme cold weather
- 2. Dress in layers
- 3. Wear a hat, scarf and gloves/mittens

- 4. Wear waterproof, insulated boots to avoid hypothermia or frostbite
- 5. Get out of wet clothes as soon as possible
- 6. Stay hydrated
- 7. Avoid excessive consumption of alcohol if you will be staying outside
- 8. <u>Check on your family, friends and neighbors</u> who may be more vulnerable. Call 9-1-1 if you are concerned about life or safety.

Vulnerable individuals include:

- o homeless individuals.
- o very old and very young individuals, in particular people over 65 years old.
- o individuals with circulation problems or those who are taking certain medications
- o those with access and functional needs.
- o those without effective heating systems

## A Message from the Sustainability Division:

Don't throw out the holiday cheer this season! Broken holiday lights should be disposed of as electronic waste, not garbage or recycling.

Putting electronic waste in the garbage will increase toxicity in the landfill which hurts our environment. String lights in the recycling stream will tangle and break the sorting machines.

Residents have options for safe electronic waste disposal.

- Drop off your broken lights at the household hazardous waste facility;
- Drop off your lights at Cupertino's next Environmental Recycling Day event January 16;
- Call Recology to schedule a pick-up (two pick-ups per year at no additional cost).
