



Evacuating Cupertino Zone CUP-E022

This map is intended to serve as a planning resource, not a guide when you are in the process of evacuating.

Plan for yourself and your household ahead of time. If you believe that you will require additional time to evacuate, treat an evacuation warning as an order and leave as soon as possible. If you feel that you are in danger, do not wait to be told to evacuate. Share your evacuation plans with neighbors, your community, and family. Share vehicles with neighbors when evacuating, if possible, to reduce road congestion. If an evacuation is ordered, routes and temporary evacuation points as well as specific instructions may be provided by public safety agencies through the AlertSCC system.

ZONE DESCRIPTION: Zone Cup-E022 includes a residential area with several businesses located southeast of the intersection of De Anza Boulevard and Stevens Creek Boulevard. Zone Cup-E022 is bounded to the south by Rodrigues Avenue, to the east by South Blaney Avenue, to the north by Stevens Creek Boulevard, and to the west by De Anza Boulevard. Zone Cup-E022 includes Cupertino Park Center Apartments, Cupertino City Center Apartments, and businesses located in Cupertino City Center.

ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS: There multiple ways out of Zone Cup-E022. Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the east or west along Stevens Creek Boulevard. Residents and visitors may exit the zone to the north or south along De Anza Boulevard heading north towards Sunnyvale or south towards Saratoga, and to the east along Rodrigues Avenue. If Zone Cup-E022 evacuates, specific routes may be specified by public safety officials. Register to receive emergency alerts for information in an emergency at AlertSCC.org.
