Our [MISSION](#) is to create safe and welcoming spaces where guests who are living in their cars can sleep, stabilize, recover, and gain access to social services. This care for the unhoused is accomplished through the collaboration of faith-based communities, local city governments, and other service organizations.

In our [COMMUNITY](#) we have unhoused individuals who are living in motor vehicles. The RSCP provides a safe place in one of the partner's parking lots and access to additional supportive services (e.g., case management, hospitality, showers). Interested individuals can initiate the application process by contacting the RSCP at [**rscpleadership@gmail.com**](mailto:rscpleadership@gmail.com), or call/text **408-641-0227**. Once screened and authorized, guests are welcomed into the RSCP program.

Our network of [SAFE PARKING HOSTS](#) provides services to our unhoused community year-round. RSCP hosts commit to serving their guests for at least one month and up to three months per calendar year (depending on location and availability). Our guests park overnight at the current RSCP location and receive access to additional supportive services. During hospitality hour, guests are welcome to engage in conversations and to enjoy home cooked meals or snack foods. Personal items (e.g. socks, toothbrushes, sleeping bags) will be given out as needed. On the first day of each month, guests transition to the next hosting site.

[VOLUNTEERING](#) for the RSCP is a rewarding experience that offers the opportunity to connect with other volunteers and people in need. A safe and supportive hosting site offers volunteers the opportunity to lend a listening ear, engage in conversations, serve food, and perform some RSCP administrative tasks in support of the program. Hospitality is always staffed with at least two volunteers.

Our [PARTNERSHIP FRAMEWORK](#) offers services to our guests and helps to ensure the well-being and safety of our guests, community members, volunteers, and hospitality hosts. These partnerships include: the cities of Saratoga and Cupertino, the County Sheriff's Department, the local YMCAs, social services agencies, local faith-based organizations, and a local college.
