# Arrive between 9 and 10 am and follow these steps:

UNLOAD:

- Unloading will be on Torre Ave in Zone 1 marked in Yellow on the map on the next page. Enter through Pacifica Drive, big Yellow Star.
- Pull forward to allow cars to enter behind you. Do not block the road it is open to the public and needs to be accessible for through traffic.
- Volunteers will help you unload from your car and bring your items to your booth space.

#### PARK:

To ensure ongoing friendly relations with the library, who shares our parking lot, we have designated two parking locations for our partners and an additional passenger unloading zone.



#### 1. About 50 spots in City Hall Parking Lot: VENDORS ONLY Google Map

Enter the City Hall parking lot from Rodrigues Ave. This <u>single space designation per</u> <u>organization</u> is meant to encourage carpooling and alternative forms of transportation.

# **<u>2.</u>** City Center Parking Garage (See map on next page): VENDORS AND ATTENDEES

Located a block away, this convenient site offers FREE spaces for all volunteers/staffers joining us on Saturday. To access the lot from Stevens Creek, take a right onto Torre Ave and the first right onto Cali Ave. The garage will be on your right. The lot can also be accessed from Rodrigues. Simply take a Left onto Torre Ave, and then your 2nd Left onto Cali Ave.

Please visit the registration/information booth (A1-A2) indicated by a white star on the layout map below before proceeding to your assigned booth.








## Partner Locations & Event Layout

# Set-up, Tables, and Chairs, and What to Bring

- Tables: All city partners will have ONE 6' x 30" table and TWO folding chairs available for your use, unless additional spaces were purchased on Eventbrite or confirmed with staff. You should consider bringing a tablecloth for your table, as the tables are quite basic (i.e. plywood).
- **2. Canopies:** The city DOES NOT provide canopies or umbrellas for partners. You are encouraged to bring one, but it can be no larger than 10x10 to fit in each space.
- **3.** No Electrical Access: Please remember that this field **does not have any electrical outlets**. Portable electric batteries are allowed. No gas generators.
- 4. Other Items to Consider Bringing:
  - **Reusable Water Bottle** water jugs will be located around the festival for your use. This is a zero waste event and we will not be providing disposable cups unless specifically requested.
  - Sunscreen and Hat
  - Money for Lunch you can visit our wonderful food trucks on site!

### Amenities and Food

Community Hall is well equipped with bathrooms and water fountains. Cupertino will also provide portable toilets and water stations, so be sure to bring your reusable water bottle.

**Lunch:** The City will be hosting food trucks again this year. There are also several restaurants located within walking distance.

#### Insurance & Liability

Please know that the City does not provide insurance for event participants. Tabling partners, vendors, and entertainers are responsible for carrying their own coverage.

The City **requires** all Festival participants to sign a <u>Waiver of Release</u>, agreeing to hold harmless the City, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers from and against any claims, loss, liability, demands, damage, and expense to the extent arising from participation in this year's Cupertino Earth and Arbor Day Festival offered by the City of Cupertino.

<u>Please bring your signed agreement (attached) to the registration booth on Saturday OR email the</u> <u>signed copy to victoriam@cupertino.org prior to the event date</u>. <u>We need one waiver for every</u> <u>individual tabling at your booth.</u> We cannot permit any organizations to participate in the festival that have not signed the agreement, so please do have a signed copy at registration. Thank you in advance for your understanding of and compliance with this requirement.
