
Make a difference: be a Master Composter!

Master Composter Volunteer Service Commitment

The Home Composting Education Program (HCEP) is part of the Santa Clara County Integrated Waste Management Program. The program relies on the services of Master Composter volunteers to provide staffing for public outreach events and training workshops to educate residents of Santa Clara County who wish to learn the art and techniques of composting. In addition to meeting specified volunteer commitments, Master Composters represent the County when working at County or city-sponsored events.

I, the undersigned, agree to volunteer my services to the County of Santa Clara for the Home Composting Education Program (HCEP). I acknowledge and agree that there is no salary or other compensation to be provided by the County for my services as a volunteer.

I understand that I will not be covered by the County's Workers Compensation during the course and scope of my volunteer services to the County. However I understand that I may be covered by the County's excess policy up to a limit of \$5,000, if expenses are not covered by my primary insurance coverage or if I do not have medical, hospitalization, or accident insurance.

In addition, I release and discharge the County of Santa Clara, its officers, volunteers, agents and/or employees from all actions, claims, losses, or demands that I, my heirs, spouse, guardians, legal representatives, or assigns may now or later have for any property damage arising or resulting from my volunteer service or activities.

I AGREE TO:

- Follow the directions of the HCEP Coordinators and/or the directions of County and city staff when working at events;
- Teach HCEP-sponsored workshops according to the approved curriculum;
- Support accomplishment of County and city goals when working at sponsored events; and
- Demonstrate appropriate professional behavior in interactions with County staff, city staff, and members of the public.

I acknowledge and agree that my services are provided for the convenience of the County and may be terminated at any time by the County without notice or hearing.

DURING TRAINING AND/OR SERVICE AS A MASTER COMPOSTER VOLUNTEER, I AGREE TO:

- 1. Participate in Prusch Park compost site maintenance.
- 2. Maintain a working composting pile or bin and a worm-composting unit in my yard or garden.
- 3. Suggest community events that may be appropriate for Master Composter participation for consideration by program directors.
- 4. Participate in outreach events or presentations to special groups such as PTA, Scouts, civic clubs, environmental clubs, schools. Event locations may be in other cities within Santa Clara County.
- 5. Attend all evening training classes and Saturday laboratory classes as well as complete all assignments and pass the final exam.
- 6. Volunteer a minimum of 50 hours to perform composting education and outreach in Santa Clara County within one year of graduation.
- 7. Maintain records of hours volunteered and number of contacts, using provided forms.
- 8. Attend at least half of the monthly in-service training meetings after graduation.

I have read and understood the above requirements. I commit to participate in the Master Composter Program as described above.
