To determine the best towns in which to live well, Forbes teamed with ZoomProspector.com, a San Francisco-based consulting firm specializing in corporate relocation. Because geographical definitions range widely, we used the term "town" to describe every city, town, borough or Census-designated-place under 100,000 people. To rank each town, we looked at median income; average commute; distance to highways and airports; per capita venture capital funding; per capita number of small businesses, sole-proprietorships and startups; the percentage of the population with bachelor's degrees or higher; the share of professional-level workers as defined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); the percentage of young and educated people, or those 25-34 with a bachelor's degree or higher; and the percentage of foreign-born residents with a bachelor's degree or higher. We also measured the per capita number of restaurants, bars, museums and cultural institutions.

<u>RESOLUTION NO. 797</u>

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CUPERTINO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA EXTENDING AN INVITATION TO THE CITY OF COPERTINO, ITALY TO BECOME A SIGTER-CITY IN THE PROFILE-TO-PROFILE PROGRAM AND INVITING THE PEOPLE OF COPERTINO TO FARTICIPATE IN SAID PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the "People-to-People Program" was established at the White House in 1956 by the President and which President John F. Kennedy of the United States, now heads as Honorary Chairman and General Dwight D. Eisenhower as Chairman of the Board of Trustees to establish greater friendship and understanding between the peoples of the United States and other nations through the medium of direct personal contact, and

WHEREAS, to implement this program, Cupertino and other cities in the United States have been requested through the American Municipal Association to affiliate with a city abroad of similar characteristics and mutual interests, and

WHEREAS, Gupertino through its Council does recognize and endorse this program with the hope that it will lead to a lasting friendship between the people of Cupertino and Copertino. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cupertino Council as follows:

Section 1. That this Council on behalf of the people of Cupertino hereby extends an invitation to the Government and people of the City of Copertino, to participate with Cupertino as its Sister-City in the "People-to-People Program" for the purpose of creating good will and understanding between the people of our two great nations.

Section 2. Verne H. Jewett, Mayor is hereby authorized to act as official representative of Cupertino to carry out this program.

Section 3. That copies of this resolution are to be sent to the Mayor and Council of the City of Copertino, Italy,
