Cupertino Safe Routes to School Student Video Contest



Project Overview

Cupertino Safe Routes to School (SR2S) and Teen Commission are hosting a video competition for 6-12 grade students. We're looking for videos that inspire people to walk, bike, scooter, or take other active modes of transportation to school (once schools re-open) or provide tips or education on how to be safe using active transportation. Videos will receive extra consideration if they include benefits of alternative transportation relating to your chosen topic. Video content could be in the form of a music video, short story, public service announcement, TikTok, animation, or any other type of video. Winning videos will be streamed on the Cupertino website, in the lobby of some City buildings after they re-open to the public, and may be played during City meetings, at school, or at school events. Winners will also receive Cupertino Safe Routes to School gear, an interview in the City Newsletter (the Scene), and public recognition from the City Council. **Submissions are due May 28, 2021.**

Acceptable Content

Videos must align with the mission of our program and fall into one of our two contest categories: Inspiration or Education. Possible topics for each category include but are not limited to: **Inspiration:**

- The joy of walking and biking
- Walk & Roll Days
- Why I walk, bike or ride a scooter to school
- Let's all walk or bike
- Active and sustainable transportation
- The future of student transportation
- How biking is cool and FUN!

Education:

- How to social distance while taking alternative transportation
- How to carry stuff on a bike (musical instrument, sporting gear, take-out dinner, etc)
- How to make sure your helmet fits and is adjusted properly
- How to be visible while taking active transportation
- How to ride in the dark
- How to ride in the rain
- How to lock your bike
- Cycling etiquette
- Any topic from <u>this</u> safety booklet

Bonus Content:

- The environmental benefits of walking and biking
- How active transportation improves grades, mental health, and/or physical health
- The benefits of carpooling





Rules

Submissions must inspire or educate others to take active transportation. Students in 6-12 grade who live or go to school in Cupertino may collaborate as a group or submit a video individually. There is no cap on the number of videos that a group or individual can submit. Video submission must be original and not a copy of anyone else's material. If a video infringes upon another's copyrighted material, including copyrighted music, it will be disqualified. Participants may be required to show proof that content is original work. Videos must not exceed 5 minutes in length. Any student under 18 who is filmed riding a bike, scooter or skateboard must wear a helmet or the video will be disqualified.

Submission Process

Upload your video to YouTube, Google Drive or Dropbox and set permissions so the video is viewable to anyone. To submit an uploaded video into the contest, fill out and sign the "Video Contest Entry Form" and "Authorization to Use Video and Release of Liability" form below. Every group member must submit both forms if the video is made by a group of students. Contestants under the age of 18 must also submit the "Parent/Guardian Signature Form." Email forms **and** a link to your video to <u>saferoutes@cupertino.org</u> by midnight Friday, May 28, 2021.

Selection Criteria and Process

Middle school and high school entries will be evaluated separately. One winner and up to two runners up will be selected for each category at both the middle school and high school levels. Submissions will be evaluated by a panel of judges which includes but is not limited to SR2S staff, high school student representatives on the SR2S Working Group, and Cupertino Teen Commissioners. Winning videos will be selected based on their effectiveness to inspire or educate (and the accuracy of the content, in the case of educational videos), and completeness of the application. Videos will also be judged on artistic merit. Late submissions or those that do not follow the criteria will not be considered. Winners will be announced on August 11, 2021 at <u>www.Cupertino.org/VideoContest</u> and at the Cupertino Safe Routes to School Working Group meeting. All participants will be sent an invitation to the meeting as the date approaches.
